**Expand opportunities for underrepresented groups in conservation** 

Funded by the Office of the CEO and jointly supervised by the Global Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion team, this two-year paid fellowship blends hands-on learning with networking opportunities that can open the door to careers with leading environmental NGOs.

For roughly 80% of the program, a cohort of full-time fellows works remotely, learning about and contributing to projects across functional areas at TNC that can include:

- Conservation
- Finance
- Human Resources
- Government and External Affairs
- Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion
- Marketing and Communications
- Compliance and Ethics
- Development
- Science

The remaining 20% is dedicated to learning and development through networking engagements, training sessions, and other events designed to hone critical nonprofit leadership skills.
